Science Awards

Throughout Terms 2 and 3 Paynesville Primary School will be participating in a science awards programme. The Science Awards programme is designed to promote students' interest and participation in a series of science activities which:

- Are assessed on a criterion referenced system
- Are well within the capacity of average students
- Encourage student initiative
- Provide a tangible reward
- Provide extension work for students

The programme is designed for most students to be able to work on by themselves at home. Parents should offer praise and occasionally some advice if there are problems. Students should be encouraged to use a variety of sources to get information. As students complete tasks they can be brought to school to be assessed and progress recorded by Carol Roberts (Science Teacher) on Tuesday lunchtimes. This is the first time we have tried this programme I will be happy to support and assist students as required.

There are 3 types of award determined by the student's grade. Each is outlined below and if you would like further information please contact me or refer to the Science Award website www.sciencebadges.co.nz

Grades 2 and 3 - Science Activity Challenges

- Students choose one of four topic sheets:
 - Pondering on Plants (Biological Sciences)
 - Tantalising Toys (Physical Sciences)
 - World of Water (Chemical Sciences)
 - Weather Watch (Earth and Space Sciences)
- Stickers are placed by the teacher on the activity sheet once it is completed by the student.
- A certificate is given in assembly once all activities are completed
- 4 6 weeks per topic is recommended
- Cost is \$2.50 per student

Grades 4 and 5 - Science Certificates

- Students choose eight activities from a total of 32 available
- At least one activity should be from each of the 4 curriculum areas; Biological, Physical, Chemical, and Earth and Space Sciences
- Stickers are placed by the teacher on the activity sheet once it is completed by the student
- A certificate is given in assembly once all activities are completed
- 6-8 weeks per certificate is recommended
- Cost is \$2.50 per student

Grade 6 - Science Badges

- Students choose a badge from a total of 29 available. The badges available are shown on this notice. Sample activities for each badge are available on the Science Badges website (refer earlier), I recommend looking through them to help make your decision.
- · An activity sheet for that topic is purchased
- There are approximately 47 points per sheet. The student must complete 20 of them
- Teachers mark each task then sign the sheet once it has been completed
- A badge and certificate is given to the student in assembly
- Within 12 months is recommended for the completion of the badge
- Cost \$6 each individual badge



Coughs, Colds and Asthma

Coughs, colds and the flu are one of the most common triggers of asthma. The common cold is caused by an upper respiratory tract infection and is a common illness for children and adults in Australia. As we approach the colder months, here are some tips to keep in mind to prevent and reduce the spread of coughs, colds and the flu:

- Avoid coughing and sneezing on or near others and wash your hands thoroughly to prevent the spread of disease.
- If your child is not feeling well, it is recommended that they stay home and rest, to reduce the spread of
 infections and to speed up their recovery process.
- Everyone should have the annual flu vaccination to ensure they are protected from this disease. You or your
 child may be eligible for the free flu vaccination. Details about who is eligible can be found here and can also
 be determined by your doctor.
- Prior to purchasing any medications or herbal and natural remedies', you should seek the advice of your
 doctor or pharmacist as some medications can react with asthma medications. Such as Aspirin,
 Ibuprofen/Naproxen (non-steroidal anti-inflammatory medications), Beta Blockers tablet and eye drops (used
 for high blood pressure and glaucoma), and ACE inhibitors (used to control blood pressure).
