#### Grade 3/4 Classroom Report



Grade 3 / 4 have returned to the classroom happy and engaged in their learning. They have enjoyed writing couplet poems and begun investigating limerick poems, always ensuring they have their capital letters and full stops in the correct positions. During reading everyone has been completing amazing reading responses with original thought, quote and an explanation.

In Math, students have explored the world of fractions and converting between fraction and decimal form. This week they have linked fractions with time specifically using terms such as quarter to and quarter past-linking quarter of the clock to the way we read time.

Last term, Grade 3 / 4 learnt about algorithms in digital technology and at the end of last term, students had the opportunity to use VR headsets. This was a good opportunity for students to link algorithms to real world technology. While using the head sets, they explored space to reinforce our learning in S.T.E.M as well as a musical game based on beats reinforcing learning from music and performing arts. This term's focus will be for 3 / 4 to create their own algorithms both on paper and using technology, they will not only expand their computer skills but also their resilience as they test and learn new skills.

### Grade 4/5 Classroom Report

The 4/5 classroom has had a busy start to Term 3! The Grade 5's have started their kindergarten visits - getting to know new preps and potential buddies for next year! The first couple of meetings have been filled with laughs and the little ones love having the 5's to read to them and push them on the swing!

In Reading we have been refreshing our reading response knowledge and looking at different styles of poetry.

In Writing students have been working poetry - starting with the AABB/ABAB couplet style along with some trying to write limericks!

In Maths students have started the term with revision on division and we will be moving on to fractions soon.

In Investigations we are starting the term looking at different world wide disasters and how these have shaped our history, along with changes that have been made since then. We started off with the sinking of RMS Titanic and how this has changed maritime safety forever. Students made timelines of the events that unfolded that night and shared these with their classmates.

It has been a wonderful start to Term 3 and I couldn't be prouder of the way everybody has come back with smiling faces and a fantastic attitude towards their learning!





#### Grade 6 Classroom Report

The Grade 6 Classroom have made a great start to this term. The class has had different teachers as Mr Floyd is in the Acting Principal role. It's been great to hear lots of positive feedback from these teachers about our class.

In reading we have looked at figurative language and inferring themes from texts. We have also made creative reading responses about the books we are judging for the Children's Book Council Awards.

In writing we have learnt about different types of poetry. Students have written limericks, acrostic and Haiku poems. We are currently in our drafting phase and will be publishing a poetry book with different types of poems.

In maths students have continued to work on their understanding of time. We have looked at different tools that help us understand time such as calendars and timetables. Students have also learnt about the different time zones we have in Australia.

Last week while Mrs Olsen was in our classroom, students learnt about how materials are manufactured and how to sew. Students learnt a lot about how our clothes are made and found the topic very interesting.

The Art Exhibition at the local Art Gallery was fantastic. It was great to see how well our students engaged with this and learnt different techniques that they can use. Thanks to Dee for organising.


